


OUTSIDE VISITS Host: Jurgen Schubert



UPCOMING VISIT TO DATACOM DATA CENTRE

Wednesday 29 October 2025

6 Orbit Dr, Rosedale, Auckland

Datacom says "We are truly excited to welcome you and your members to our facility in Auckland". There are a few requirements and conditions we must comply with:

Security:

- 1. This is a high security facility. A list of all visitors needs to be lodged days before and will be checked on arrival against ID, either NZ Driving Licence or passport.
- 2. No photos are permitted, but a general area is there for a group photo.

Safety:

- 1. This is a high voltage facility and **not** suitable for visitors wearing a pacemaker.
- 2. There is a significant amount of walking with steep stairs between floors and visitors should wear suitable flat shoes.
- 3. All visitors and staff are required to wear hard hats in parts of the facility. Datacom will provide hard hats and earmuffs as there are areas of high noise.
- 4. The visit is not recommended for anyone who has concerns about high noise and flashing lights.

Tour Length:

Between 60 and 90 minutes.

Group Size:

Maximum 16

Date and Time:

Wednesday 29th October at 10 am. No SeniorNet activity that day.

Travel:

Parking at Datacom is limited and we should car share travelling with the least number of cars. We will meet at our usual spot at the car park of the Events Centre with entry from Silverfield and leave for Datacom at 9:30 am. It is a trip of about 8km and may take 20 min depending on traffic. (See also Roll Closure).

Cost:

There is no cost and Datacom would be pleased to offer refreshments if time allows

Roll Closure:

Latest mid-day Friday 24th October (see Safety point 1) or once we have reached the maximum of 16, whichever comes first. Please let me know in good time of your interest and whether you can offer a lift or need one.

Understanding the MRT Command in Windows

What Is the MRT Command? The MRT command launches the Malicious Software Removal Tool (MSRT)—a built-in Windows utility designed to detect and remove specific, prevalent types of malware. Unlike full-fledged antivirus software, MSRT focuses on cleaning up infections that have already occurred, particularly those caused by high-profile threats like Blaster, Sasser, and Mydoom.

To run it:

- Press Windows + R
- Type mrt and hit Enter
- Choose your scan type: Quick, Full, or Custom

When Should You Use MRT? While MRT isn't a substitute for real-time protection, it's useful in specific scenarios:

- Post-Infection Cleanup: If your system shows signs of malware and you suspect Defender missed it.
- **Monthly Maintenance**: MRT runs automatically once a month via Windows Update, but manual scans can be triggered anytime.
- **Second Opinion Scan**: Use MRT as a backup tool to double-check your system after running other antivirus scans.

MRT vs. Windows Defender: Key Differences

Feature	Windows Defender	MRT (Malicious Software Removal Tool)
ProtectionType	Real-time antivirus and anti- malware	On-demand malware removal
Operation Mode	Active background protection	Manual or scheduled monthly scan
Scope of Detection	Broad, including ransomware, spyware, trojans	Limited to specific, known malware strains
Detection Method	Cloud-based, heuristic, and signature-based	Signature-based only
Interface	Full-featured dashboard	Simple wizard-style interface
Update Frequency	Updated daily	Updated monthly via Windows Update

Think of **Windows Defender** as your **security guard**, actively preventing threats from entering your system. **MRT**, on the other hand, is the **cleanup crew**, stepping in to remove specific infections that may have slipped through.

For optimal protection:

- Keep Windows Defender active and updated
- Use MRT periodically or when you suspect a missed infection
- Don't rely solely on MRT—it's a reactive tool, not a proactive shield

The MRT command runs the Malicious Software Removal Tool (MSRT), a built-in Windows utility that scans for and removes specific types of malware. It's best used for post-infection

cleanup, especially if you suspect malware that slipped past your main antivirus.

Unlike **Windows Defender**, which offers **real-time protection**, **MRT** is a **reactive tool**—it doesn't prevent threats but helps clean up known infections. Defender is continuously updated and monitors your system, while MRT runs monthly or manually and targets only a limited set of threats. For full protection, use **Windows Defender** as your primary defence and **MRT** as a backup scanner.


