



Roger Barnes

Roger is a semi-retired heraldic artist, and has written, illustrated, and published three books (Monsters of Heraldry, The Armorial Bearings of the Surnames of Scotland, volume one, and (under the pseudonym of Leogard Branderson), The Tale of the Little King), and numerous articles in The New Zealand Armorist, the quarterly magazine of The Heraldry Society of New Zealand, of which he is Secretary, Treasurer, Information Officer, Archivist, and a Fellow.

His talk will be on the basics of heraldry, with many images illustrating the similarities and differences between various coats of arms.



David Verran

David Verran has been researching, writing and speaking about North Shore History since the 1990s. He has also been guiding people through Symonds Street Cemetery since the early 1990s, and some SeniorNet members have come on those walks. He has a MA Hons degree in history, worked in libraries from 1975 to 2017 and currently volunteers at Birkenhead and Devonport Museums, Auckland Council Archives and for the Friends of Symonds Street Cemetery. Amongst other things he also writes a monthly Local History column for 'Channel' magazine here on the North Shore. He will reflect on how he became an historian and on family links to the North Shore.

OUR VISIT TO DEVONPORT MUSEUM

August 2025



Devonport is one of Auckland's earliest nineteenth century European settlements. It has a dramatic volcanic past, evident in the shape of the land, a close relationship with the sea and a long history of settlement by Maori. It has been home to the New Zealand Navy for many years and has a strong connection with the Army. It was a significant centre for early shipbuilding and the base for transport as far north as Waiwera. Devonport is recognised as having some of the best streetscapes of nineteenth century commercial and residential buildings in New Zealand.



A group of twelve SeniorNetters gathered for a visit to the Devonport Museum, hidden away from the street in Cambria Park. Local historian David Verran gave an introduction and was then available for questions as we went about viewing the exhibits, many of which we had memories of.





From around March 1976 the Devonport Borough Council and the Devonport Library Associates worked to create a museum in Devonport. On 30th March 1978, the old 1890 Devonport Presbyterian church building was moved and restored onto the Mt Cambria site. The museum, now housed in the former church, was opened in February 1980.

The Devonport Museum specialises in memorabilia and resource materials pertaining primarily to the history of Devonport and its people. Other artefacts and material may be considered for inclusion in the collections. It continues to be dedicated to preserving local heritage and history and presenting the local stories.

UPCOMING VISIT TO AUCKLAND LIBRARY BOOK SORTING CENTRE

Wednesday 24th September 2025 at 11am

The Centre is off the street at 17 Saleyards Rd, Ōtāhuhu and within Urgent Couriers and is a smaller version of the NZ Post Mail Sorting Centre.

There are a few requirements for the visit and these are quoted here:

- Address: Urgent Couriers 17 Saleyards, Otahuhu
- Parking: There are 1-2 visitor carparks on site, but if they are in use or you need more, please park on the street. It is a busy street, so be careful.
- Everyone must be wearing closed toed shoes
- Long hair must be tied back
- This is a warehouse whose doors are kept open, so I recommend wearing warm layers.
- The person you're visiting is Anesh Singh, but someone from my team will be there as well.
- Please send me the names of everyone planning to attend the week before. This will help speed up checking into the site
- There is a very popular pie shop next door at Lunch bar Eighty8, if anyone loves a good pie.

Date and Time: Wednesday 24th September 2025 at 11am.

Travel: Per car sharing, meeting at 10am at the car park of the Events Centre with entrance from Silverfield off Porana Road. Below is a map with a highlighted area where we usually meet.

As stated above, there is limited parking at our destination and we should travel with the least number of cars possible. When I checked it out, there was no parking on site in the confined space and the roadside is the only option. A travel time of 45 min should be considered.

Cost: Visit is free of charge.

Booking: I need to know by no later than Tuesday 16th September of anyone interested to go and let me have your email and mobile phone number. Most importantly, let me know whether you take your car and how many passengers you can accommodate or whether you need a lift. The round trip is just over 50km and for those needing a lift, I suggest at least \$4 for the driver is appropriate. Without drivers we have no outings.

Café: Lunch bar Eighty8 is in front of the building (at the roadside). It is very basic and only a take-away food bar but will check out an alternative.


For learning Painting and Craft – the internet is an amazing source of knowledge for us all – we just need to learn how to use it and embrace it for our own needs.

How to Record Video Using Xbox Game Bar on Windows 11

The Xbox Game Bar is a built-in feature in Windows 11 that allows you to record screen activity, capture gameplay, and take screenshots. Follow these steps to start recording your screen like a pro. You can use this feature to record instruction of any apps.

Before you begin, make sure, you're using Windows 11. Your system supports Game Bar recording (some apps like File Explorer and desktop may not be recordable). You're not in Administrator mode, as Game Bar won't record apps running with elevated permissions.

Enable Xbox Game Bar

Open Settings: Press Windows + I.

Go to Gaming > Xbox Game Bar.

Toggle "Open Xbox Game Bar using this button on a controller" to ON (optional).

Ensure "Enable Xbox Game Bar for things like recording game clips..." is ON.

Start Recording

Launch the app or window you want to record.

Press Windows + G to open the Xbox Game Bar overlay.

In the Capture widget:

Click the Record button (●) to start recording.

Alternatively, press Windows + Alt + R to begin recording instantly.

A small recording bar will appear on the screen showing the timer and stop button.

Stop Recording

Click the Stop button (■) on the recording bar.

Or press Windows + Alt + R again to stop.

Your video will be saved automatically.

Find Your Recordings


Navigate to: C:\Users\[YourName]\Videos\Captures

Or open File Explorer and go to the Videos > Captures folder.

Please note that Use Windows + Alt + M to toggle microphone recording during a session. You can pin the Capture widget for easier access. For non-game apps, make sure they're in windowed mode to ensure compatibility.

Limitations - Xbox Game Bar cannot record the desktop or File Explorer. It's best suited for apps and games running in windowed or full-screen mode.

The Xbox Game Bar's video recording feature offers a convenient and built-in solution for capturing screen activity on Windows 11 without needing third-party software. It's especially useful for recording gameplay, tutorials, or app demonstrations with minimal setup. With simple keyboard shortcuts and automatic saving, users can quickly start and stop recordings, making it ideal for fast, on-the-fly content creation. Plus, its integration with Windows ensures smooth performance and easy access to customization settings like audio input and video quality.
