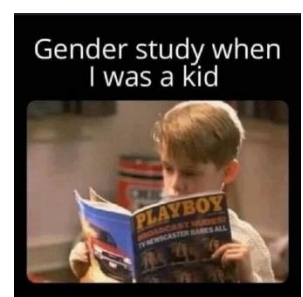

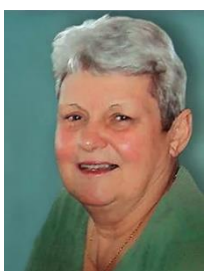
Come along and learn about cooking for one, two or more people. Share favourite recipes and find new recipes to try. There is a new topic every month to tantalise your taste buds.

### MARCH SUNDAY MEETING

#### MATT ELLIOTT

Our March speaker, Matt, has been a long-time researcher and follower of the skills of Billy T James and was well equipped to give us a look back at a remarkable talent.

Billy T. James remains one of New Zealand's most beloved entertainers, a comedian who made the difficult art of making people laugh appear effortless. With his mischievous smile, distinctive giggle, and unforgettable yellow towel, Billy became a familiar and cherished presence in homes across the country.



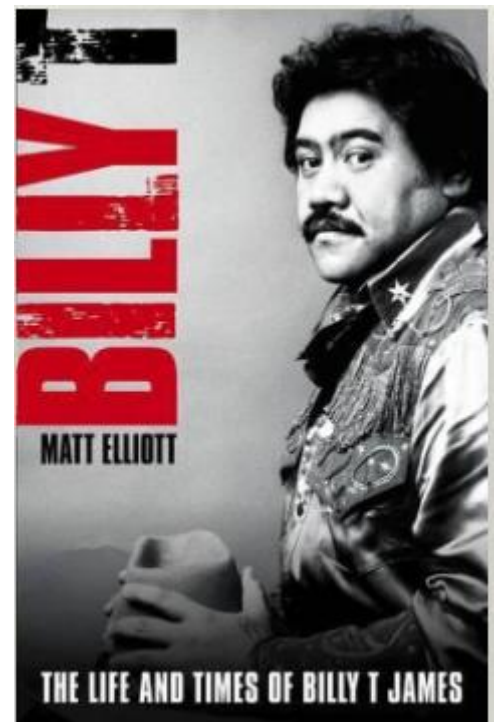
A remarkably versatile performer, he could sing, play instruments, mimic accents, dance, sketch cartoons, and deliver jokes with impeccable timing. His comedy style drew on everyday New Zealand life, often reflecting characters and moments he had observed around him. The famous towel-around-the-neck persona, for instance, grew out of memories from his days at the Māori Boys' Hostel in Auckland, where late-night storytelling, laughter, and mimicry helped shape his natural gift for entertainment.

Billy first gained national recognition through *Radio Times*, playing the pompous English announcer Dexter Fitzgibbon—so convincingly that many viewers struggled to believe the character was actually played by a shy Māori performer. His popularity quickly led to *The Billy T. James Show*, where sketches such as “Te News” and his legendary home-improvement parody delighted audiences with cheeky wordplay and distinctly Kiwi humour.

What made Billy special was not simply the jokes, but the warmth behind them. His comedy allowed New Zealanders to laugh together at shared experiences without cruelty or malice. Off stage he was known as a gentle, generous, and somewhat shy man who simply wanted to make people happy.

Even decades after his passing at just 42, the mention of Billy T. James still brings a smile. His humour, kindness, and unmistakable style secured him a unique place in New Zealand's cultural history.

## TECHNICAL ARTICLE

### Transferring music from your Windows desktop to your iPad using several methods.

Here are the best options:

#### 1. Using iTunes (Wired or Wi-Fi Sync)

**Requirements:** Install [iTunes for Windows](#) if you haven't already.

##### Steps:

1. **Connect your iPad** to your Windows PC using a USB cable (or use Wi-Fi sync if enabled).
2. **Open iTunes** on your PC.
3. Click on the **device icon** (iPad) in the top-left corner.
4. Go to **Music** in the left sidebar.
5. Check "**Sync Music**" and choose either:
  - **Entire library** (syncs all songs)
  - **Selected playlists, artists, albums, and genres** (pick specific music)
6. Click **Apply** or **Sync** to transfer the music.

*To enable Wi-Fi sync:*

- Go to **Summary** in iTunes, check "**Sync with this iPad over Wi-Fi**", and apply changes.
- Now, the iPad will sync when on the same Wi-Fi network as your PC.

---

#### 2. Using iCloud Drive (Wireless)

**Requirements:** iCloud for Windows (optional).

##### Steps:

1. Open **iCloud Drive** on your PC or visit [iCloud.com](https://www.icloud.com).
2. Upload your music files (MP3, AAC, etc.).
3. On your iPad, open the **Files** app.
4. Find and download the songs from iCloud Drive.

### 3. Using a USB Flash Drive with the Files App

If you have a **USB-C to USB adapter** (or a Lightning adapter for older iPads), you can:

1. Copy music to a USB drive.
2. Plug it into your iPad.
3. Open the **Files** app to access and copy the files.

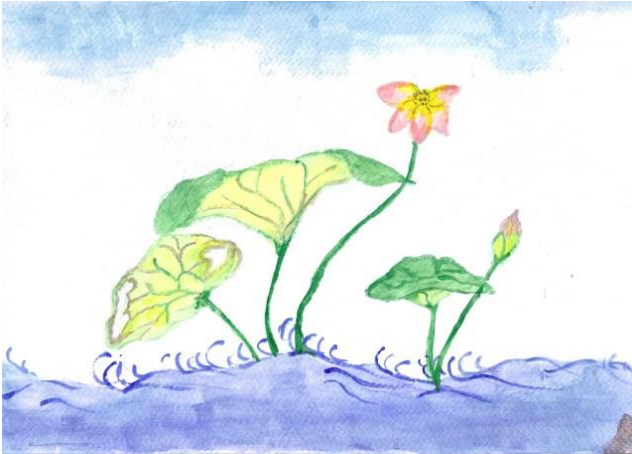

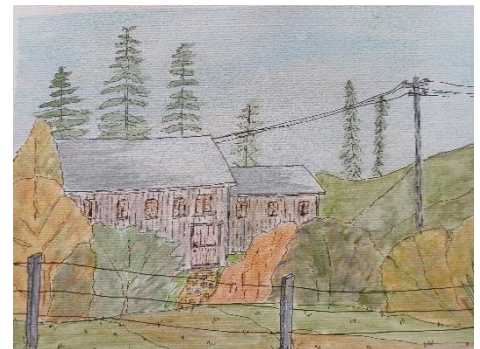
