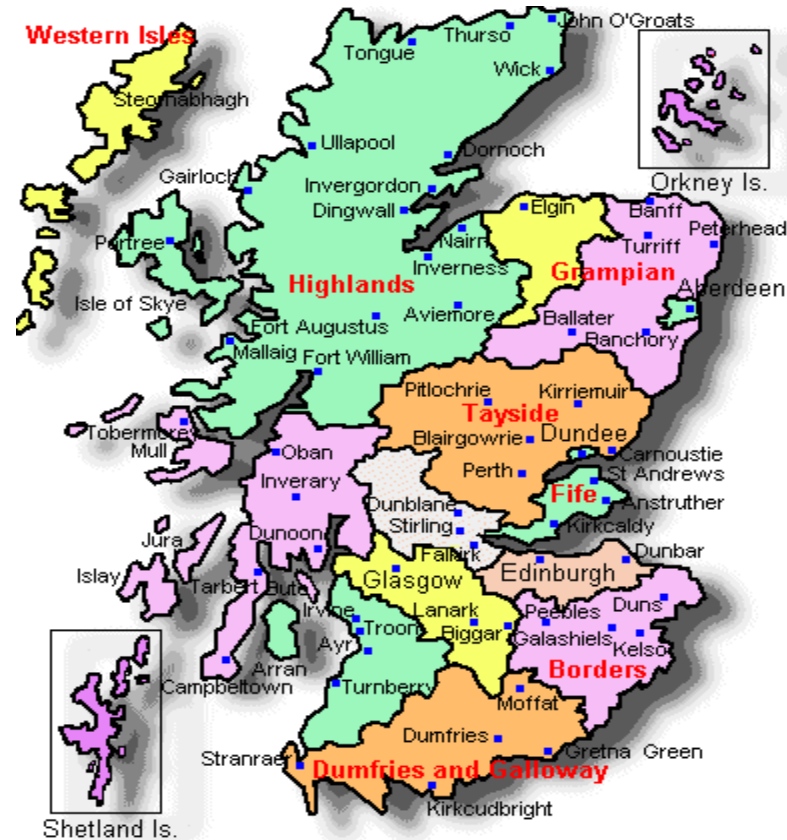

Search the statutory (civil) registers of births, marriages and deaths in Scotland from 1855 to the present.

Church registers
Search church registers of births (or baptisms), marriages and burials in Scotland from 1553 onwards.

Census returns
Search the lists of people recorded in censuses taken every 10 years in Scotland from 1841 onwards.

Valuation rolls
Search lists of owners and occupiers of buildings and other properties in Scotland from 1855 onwards.

Legal records
Search wills and testaments, coats of arms, soldiers' and airmen's wills and the records of military service appeals tribunals.

Poor relief and migration records
Search the records for the Highland and Island Emigration Society 1852-57, set up to relieve Highland destitution.

Prison registers
Search registers of people admitted to Scottish prisons to 1921. Registers for Edinburgh Bridewell, Edinburgh (Calton) Prison, Largs Prison and Perth Prison are available.

Employment records
Search employment-related records of the Commissioners of Northern Lighthouses (Northern Lighthouse Board) and the Scottish Women's Land Army.

rather disposed to give their children a good education ; at the time this account was wrote, there were thirteen Latin scholars at the two parish schools ; the other children are certain of being taught to read English, write and cast accompts ; the common style of education is carried on in the following manner : They learn the sounds of the letters, and the union of syllables, in the small spelling book ; then they receive the large spelling book ; then they get the New Testament, and the Bible, in which they commonly read some time ; and then the Collection : they get a question in the common catechism to repeat every morning : there is a public repetition on Saturday, with a psalm on Monday. There being several public works in the parish, the night-school is considerable, being wholly made up of grown persons, who attend for the purposes of writing and arithmetic, &c. The wages are
